All University Fund (AUF) will support the Thomas A. Dooley Foundation, Radio Free Europe, Mental Health, USO and the American Cancer Society in its annual fund drive, according to Bob Milligan, AUF president.

The fund drive will begin Saturday Oct. 29 with a dance in the Nebraska Union following the Missouri game. Carnival-type booths will also be set up in the Union.

Letters are being sent to all campus activities to encourage nominations for the Activities Queen who will be announced at the dance, said Jennifer Marshall, special events chairman.

Preliminary interviews for Activities Queen will be Oct. 20 and the final interviews will be Oct. 27. Students and faculty will make up the interviewing panel.
