

Freshmen Open Season Against K-State Friday

Nebraska's freshmen football team, 3-1 in conference competition last year, will open their four game season this Friday against the Kansas State frosh in Nebraska's Memorial Stadium.

The Kansas State team already has one game under their belt, beating the Oklahoma frosh Monday, 17-7.

"We don't know anything about K-State," said Husker freshmen coach John Milton Tuesday, pointing out that Nebraska doesn't scout the freshmen opponents on the Husker schedule.

"But they must be pretty good if they can beat Oklahoma," said Milton "you would think Oklahoma would be able to out-recruit Kansas State."

"Unknown Quantity" Milton said it would be pretty hard to compare the potential of this year's Nebraska freshmen team with those of the past.

"They all start out as an unknown quantity," he said. "Our defense looks better than our offense, but it takes longer to teach a

team offense. We do think we have some fine football players."

Milton called Omaha's 197-pound halfback Joe Orduna a "good back" and said that Gale Williams, a 236-pound tackle from Meadow Grove, Neb., and Keith Hayward, a 204-pound guard from Bay City, Michigan, had been looking good.

The end tandem of Paul Topfiff, 6-foot-2, 199 pounds from Lincoln, and Ed Larson, 6-foot, 199 pounds from Sioux City, Iowa, were also credited with turning in good performances so far in practice.

Milton said it would take a game or two to decide what kind of team the freshmen would develop into, adding that "the varsity has been handling us pretty good in practice."

"Unknown Quantity"

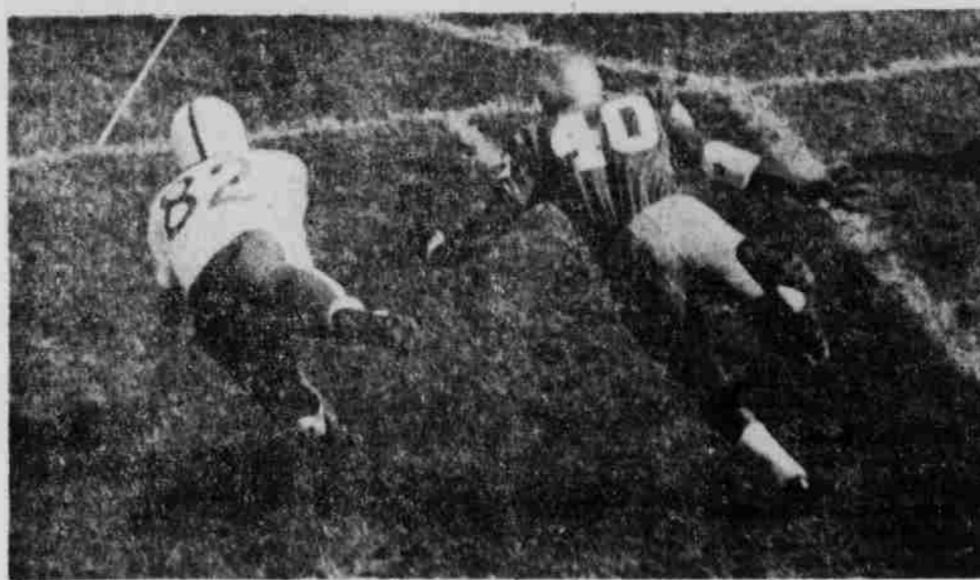
Milton said it would be pretty hard to compare the potential of this year's Nebraska freshmen team with those of the past.

The Nebraska frosh will feature the same multiple offense T-formation employed by the varsity, "but we'll use only about one third of their plays," said Milton.

From the fifty-man squad now reporting to practice, the Husker freshmen coach will pick a first offensive and defensive unit along with a swing team which can go either way to use against the K-State frosh.

Nebraska's second game will be October 28th when they host the Missouri freshmen. The Tiger cubs posted an identical 3-1 record as Nebraska last season, and were the only team to beat the Husker freshmen. Nebraska's final two games will be on the road November 4th at Kansas University and November 11th at Iowa State.

Injuries Hurt NU Offense

Nebraska will face the Kansas State Wildcats Saturday without the services of two players who were starters at the beginning of the season.

Both right end Dennis Richnafsky and left halfback Ron Kirkland will be sidelined for Nebraska's Homecoming battle with the Wildcats.

Kirkland's leg is still in a cast from a knee injury sustained in the Iowa State game and is expected out of action for at least four weeks.

Richnafsky suffered a hairline fracture in his right ankle Saturday against Wisconsin, and Husker Coach Bob Devaney

Says he will be missing for "several games."

Richnafsky, Nebraska's leading receiver with 121 yards in 12 catches, is expected to be replaced by either Tom Penney or Miles Kimmel in Saturday's starting lineup.

Junior Ben Gregory is again being counted on to fill in for Kirkland at the left halfback spot. Gregory accounted for 65 yards on 11 carries against the Badgers.

Husker coach John Melton, who scouted Kansas State's 27-0 loss to Missouri calls the Wildcats a team "with some outstanding individuals."

Milton tabs K-State back Davis and Ozzie Cain as one of the best if not the best one-two punch Nebraska will have faced so far this year.

Davis' credentials this season include the best rushing average in the Big Eight (6.1 yards), the best net yardage in one game (161 yards against Army), and the longest touchdown run (89 yards against Army.)

"We will have to play up to our potential or find ourselves in plenty of trouble," said Milton.

Sooners Push Passing

Not since 1944 has an Oklahoma team placed the Big Eight in the aerial phase—for that matter, even been close to the top spot. The Sooner philosophy had been "sooner run than gun, or spray and pay."

However, the Oklahomans

have pushed their passing per-game average up to the 155.3 level this week, taking over from Nebraska. This is an all-time high for the Sooners, and the best game standard for the league since 1951 when Tony Scardino was pitching Missouri to a 176 clip.
