First Snow Brings **Ducks For Opener**

The snow that fell on Lincoln Thursday was an appropriate reminder that the basketball season has arrived at the Cornhusker campus with Nebraska hosting the 1966-67 season opener tonight against Oregon University Ducks at 7:35 in the Coliseum.

Husker coach Joe Cipriano, the Big Eight Coaca of the Year last season, will have a veteran studded team back this season from last year's Nebraska squad which posted 20-5 overall record and was runner-up to Kansas in the Big Eight Conference.

"We're always a little nervous with the opener," "but we've been playing against ourselves for the past weeks and we're anxious to go up against some outside competition."

Cipriano is expected to start the top five returning scorers from the 1965-66 squad in Tom Baack (386). Nate Branch (338), Stuart Lantz (306), Willie Campbell (167) and Jim Damm (69). Baack, Branch, Lantz and Campbell were starters last year.

Missing this year will be Grant Simmons whose leadership and scoring were influential in Nebraska's success last season. Simmons, a guard, scored 380 points in his final year at Nebraska and was an All Big Eight and district All-American selection. Cipriano said that as things stand now, Damm and Ron


