Cagers In For Bad Luck?

Some psychological factors are building an atmosphere of bad luck as the Nebraska basketball team prepares for a return match with Iowa State, Saturday at Ames.

The biggest of these factors will be the home court advantage Nebraska used to its benefit in defeating the Cyclones last weekend, 94-82. This time the shoe will be on the other foot.

The Huskers are tied for second place at 6-2 with Colorado who defeated Iowa State Monday night.

Both are a game behind nationally fifth-ranked Kansas.

"This is a crucial game for us," noted Nebraska coach Joe Cipriano. "We have to win this one to stay in the race for the conference title."

Perhaps he wishes basketball was a six-man game. Each game he has had to decide between juniors Ron Simmons and Jim Damm for his second starting guard. This time he has chosen Simmons.

"We thought Simmons played an improved ball game (against the Cyclones) and shot well," explained Cipriano.

The other starters will be Stuart Lantz, forwards Tom Baack and Nate Branch, and Willie Campbell, center.

There is one more edge the Cyclones may have Saturday. The game is being televised as the Big Eight TV game-of-the-week, and Iowa State has never lost a televised game.

And as if enough is not worrying the Huskers, they will also be going after their 13th win of the season.

First Junior Since Chamberlain In 1958...

Smith's Sweaty Palms Itch For 1,000

If Iowa State's Don Smith has "sweaty palms" Saturday when the Cyclones host Nebraska, he will be the first junior in the Big Eight to hit 1,000 career points since 1958 and Wilt Chamberlain.

Smith, the Conference's leading scorer for the second week in a row, needs only 22 to cross into the 1,000 range during this week's Big Eight TV Game of the Week Saturday at Ames.

A tip-off as to whether Smith will have a good game or not, according to Smith himself, is the amount of perspiration collected on his hands before the game. The more, the better the game, or so goes the Iowa State thinking. According to this theory, Smith has sweated a great deal since the first of January, scoring 25.7 points a game to lead the Conference.

If he maintains this pace, he will end up fifth on the all-time single-season Conference list with 632 points. This would be the second highest total ever scored by a junior in Conference history — Chamberlain scored 633 his junior, and last year at Kansas.

This same average would let Smith finish his second year as a Cyclone with 1,081 points, the 21st best recorded in a career by a Big Eight basketball player. This kind of an ending would put Smith into position to move into third place on the all-time Conference list, providing the Brooklyn, New York, junior hits for over 500 next year.

A duplication of his projected junior-year total would put Smith second to the all-time All-American from Kansas, Clyde Lovellette, who had 1,979 points during his three seasons. In second place now is Kansas State's Bob Boozer, who finished in 1959 with 1,685.

and seventh in rebounding (8.1). They are tied for third in field-goal accuracy with 54 per cent.

Remaining in contention for his second scoring championship is Missouri's Ron Coleman, who shows a 19.2 average this year. On

For the sixth straight week, Smith leads the rebounders with his 12.8 per-game average. He now has a total of 266 for the season, marking the second straight year he has made the Big Eight's seasonal rebounding honor roll (it takes 250 or more to make the list). Smith's career total in this department now stands at 592, 17th on the all-time list. A retention of this average will move him into the top 15 by the end of the season.

Still battling it out for versatility honors are Oklahoma's Don Sidle and Nebraska's Stuart Lantz, both of whom are ranked in all four individual categories for the sixth consecutive week. Sidle, a 6-8 center, is second in scoring (25.0) and rebounding (10.5), and fifth in free throwing (81 per cent). Lantz, a 6-3 guard, is third in scoring (20.4) and free throwing (83 per cent),
