Nebraska Notables Featured At Centennial Week, May 1-5

An expert on Buffalo Bill, three historians, a Nebraska artist and art critic, a folk singer and a newspaperman will be featured speakers at the Nebraska teach-in during ASUN Centennial week May 1-5.

Centennial Committee Chairman Elaine Kallos said the speakers will be conducting continuous lectures, talks and discussion on Nebraska, its people, resources and history in the Nebraska Union lounge on Thursday, May 4, the last day of the campus celebration of the state's 100th birthday.

Also scheduled for Thursday is an inter-ethnic festival sponsored by the International Student Association, Miss Kallos said. The festival will focus on the contribution international students have made to the state, she said.

Other activities set for the three day celebration include dress-up day Wednesday, May 3, a special melodrama presented Wednesday night by the Old Crusty Minstrels, and a photo and art exhibit featuring the works of Nebraska artists and Nebraska scenes.

The dress-up day plans call for Western wear to replace the campus's traditional well-pressed slacks or tent dresses.

Awards, Debate
Awards for the Soberest Sheriff, Dandiest Dude, Cutest Country Maid and other categories will be made to dressed up students at a special Wednesday Hyde Park which features a debate between Former ASUN President Terry Schaaf and Cathie Shattuck.

Mrs. Joyce Luke, chairman of the Social Action Committee of the Lincoln Unitarian Church said representatives of 35-40 Lincoln organizations are meeting to discuss the problem.

She said there have been several reports that non-white students have been turned away from University-approved housing because of race.

cedures so in the future voting irregularities may be easily detected.

He added the Commission will continue to check the voters' lists from the Senate election to determine cases of double balloting.

After a complete investigation has been finished, he said, the Commission may prosecute any offenders in the Student Court.

Improve Campus
Accepting the ASUN president's seat, Dick Schulze said the Senate "has been given the responsibility to safeguard the student interest at the University and to improve the campus as the students feel it should be."

He termed the Senate's duties next year as "difficult but not impossible."

"The most immediate concern of the Senate," he continued, "is to establish broad campus support" for ASUN programs.

He added that the Senate "must look to the student for ultimate direction."

Vice-Presidents
Gene Pokorny was installed as first vice-president and Mimi Rose was installed as second vice-president.

Miss Rose resigned her Senate seat, representing the College of Arts and Science, to which she was re-elected.
