Hunt, who was born in Scottsbluff in 1906, attended the University where he was a member of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity and an Inter-Collegiate Representa-tive of the University Y.M.C.A.

He earned his B. A. Degree in 1929 and his Masters Degree in 1930 at Nebraska. In 1933 he received his Ph.D. at Cornell. Illinois Professor

Hunt was a professor ta Brown, Columbia, and Pembroke Universities before taking a position at the University of Illinois where he has been Professor and Coordinator of Training in Clinical and Counseling Psychology since 1951.






Olson To Address Meeting Of IDA


