

ETV Presents Rededication

Live coverage of ceremonies rededicating Nebraska's State Capitol tops the viewing schedule this week on stations of the Nebraska Educational Network Wednesday, June 14, at 2 p.m.

According to Centennial Commission officials, the ceremonies are expected to include the massing of colors with up to 200 color guard units participating; an address by Governor Norbert Tiemann, and the presentation of a commemorative plaque to members of the Capitol Building Commission.

Two special guests will appear on the statewide telecast: Hugo Srb, a long-time clerk of the Legislature, and R. C. Harris of Fremont, the only living senator who served in the 1919 session which appropriated funds to construct Nebraska's Capitol.

This is another program in a series of special Nebraska Centennial events being presented live on the ETV Network.

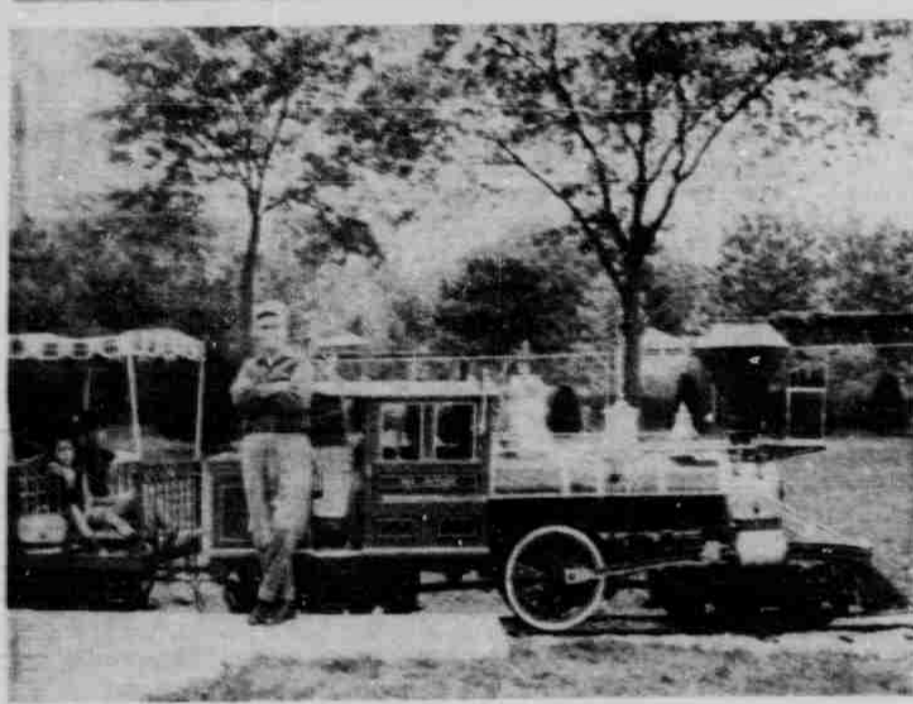
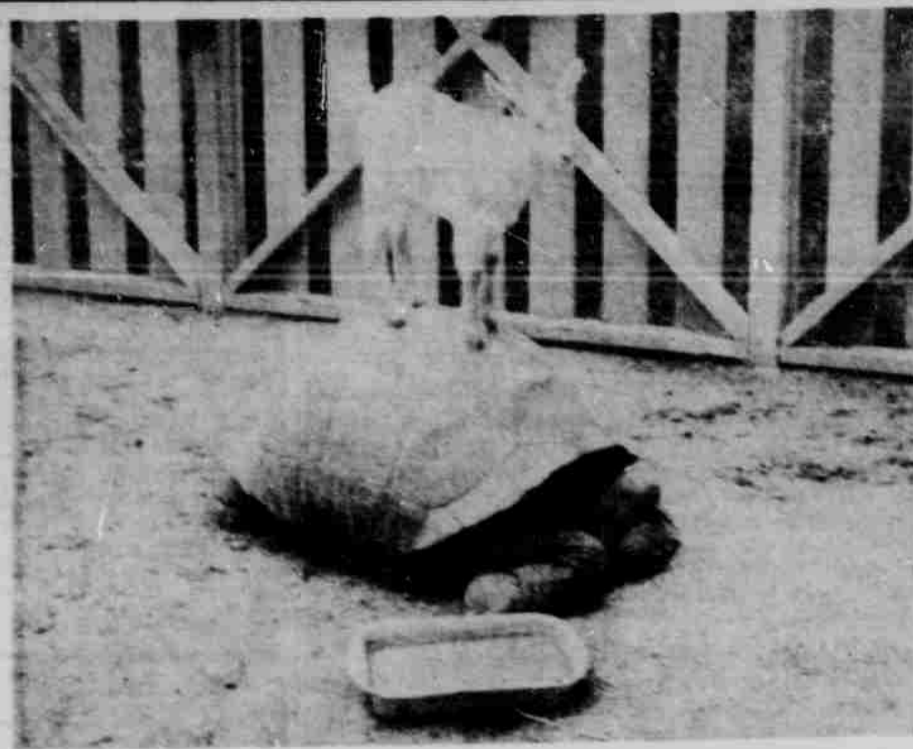

Department of Recreation Sponsors Varied Activities

The Lincoln Recreation Department offers summer session students an opportunity to participate in a variety of recreational activities according to Director James H. Ager.

Sailboating and canoeing instructions are being sponsored by the department at Holmes Lake. Red Cross Certificates will be awarded to those completing the course.

The Show Wagon, contributed to the Recreation Department by the Journal-Star Printing Company, will host shows on weekday nights on the playgrounds of the Lincoln Public Schools.

Dancing, singing, tapping and all types of variety acts can be used. Both adults and youth are qualified to audition for the several performances. Talents from all of Lincoln will be featured by the Show Wagon.

Instructions in tennis, golf,

judo, fencing and throwing horseshoes are being offered for Lincoln residents along with swimming and diving lessons.

"Fad" dancing lessons will be sponsored by the department and guns and ammunition are furnished for those taking instruction in riflery.

Baseball and softball fans will be able to continue supporting their favorite league teams as the six city ball organizations wind up for play.

Men's softball teams will play evenings on diamonds at University Place, Cooper Park, Ballard Field in Havelock and Mury Park. Slow pitch leagues begin their second season this summer.

Leisure time can be spent either in participating in one of these many sports activities or in being a spectator.

Those interested in arts and crafts may take lessons in art composition, outdoor oils, ceramics, knitting, sculpture, plastic, lapidary and modern dance.

Lincoln's many parks provide areas for picnics and other leisure time activities.

The Children's Zoo which officially opened in July, 1965, has attracted over 100,000 children and adults. The zoo's Iron Horse Railroad winds around a creek, across a trestle and through a tunnel. Visitors may enter some of the cages to feed and pet the animals.

The Chet Ager Nature Center is provided to conduct community outdoor programs in natural sciences, nature study and appreciation, as well as conservation. The center stresses learning and personal enrichment in an outdoor environment.

Films Presented
