

NU Agronomy Club Honored With 'Best In Nation' Title

The University Agronomy Club received national acclaim this past week at the 59th annual meeting of the American Society of Agronomy (ASA) held in Washington, D.C.

The club, represented by ten students and their faculty advisors, Drs. James Drew and Wm. Colville, gained recognition as the best group in the nation both individually and as a whole.

The club was presented Wednesday with a trophy and a \$200 cash prize for being the outstanding club in the nation. The award was based on the club's accomplishments during the past year.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Some of the club's achievements include increasing the treasury from an \$80 deficit to over \$2,000 and having the largest membership in the nation, which is 80.

Other achievements of the club during the past year are promoting agriculture with groups, such as the National FFA convention,

and having an annual tour over a five state area for club members.

About 50 clubs from across the country competed for the honor. The club last won the top national award in 1953.

WINNING SPEECH

Charles Juricek, agronomy club member, was awarded first place and \$100 in the national speech contest.

His speech entitled "Agriculture, Key to World Peace" was judged the best of some 100 entries.

This is the second year in a row that the University club has won in this area.

HONOR STUDENT

Juricek, a senior from Jansen, is in the agriculture honors program and received a freshman Regent's scholarship and an upper-class Regent's scholarship for one year.

He has held the Luther Drake Memorial Scholarship for three years and is a member of ASUN and of the Agriculture Executive Board.

ESSAY WINNERS

An Agronomy Club mem-

ber, Robert Sukup of Verdigré, won third place in the annual ASA student essay contest.

He has received \$80 and a bronze medal from the American Potash Institute. His essay, "New approach to Narrow Row Planting," will be published in "Crops and Soils" magazine.

Another agronomy student, Mrs. Judith Boyle of Lincoln, received \$60 from the American Potash Institute for her fifth place essay, "High Lysine Corn—A Scientific Breakthrough."

Thirty-six essays were

submitted to the national contest by local contest winners at 16 universities.

ELECTED PRESIDENT

The club received an additional honor when William J. Amen of Lincoln was elected president of the Student Activities Section of the ASA.

Amen is majoring in plant pathology under the Agricultural College honors study program. He is active in Agronomy Club, East Union, Farm House fraternity and is a former Regents and Ak-Sar-Ben scholarships winner.
