

Wegner: Eye Appeal **Aids Taste Appeal**

Eye appeal aids taste appeal, according to Ellen Wegner, production manager of the newly remodeled Selleck Quadrangle dining hall.

Miss Wegner said that the atmosphere created by the remodeling job helps to make the cafeteria more intimate and less like an institution.

"We're striving to get away from an army barracks type atmosphere,' she explained.

Mrs. Cecilia Bona, Selleck's director of food service, said that Selleck's dining hall is now the only one on campus with carpeting. "We also have carpeting on the supporting poles," she explained, which helps the poles blend in with the de-COT.

Mrs. Bona said that other improvements include new furniture, drapes, and freshly painted walls.

Two NU Students Participate In Stillman College Exchange

Next semester two University of Nebraska students will participate in an exchange program with Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Ala., according to Margaret Van Cleve, chairman of the ASUN exchange program committee

She said this will be the first semester for Nebraska students to enroll at Stillman with the exchange program, although the University hosted two Stillman students first semester last year. She added that as interest grows, ASUN hopes to expand the program to

Stillman College is a fully accredited school and all credits, a C or above, will transfer, said the committee chairman. Stillman is a small private Negro col-

lege with an enrollment of 690

"ASUN was very pleased with the number of applicants for the exchange, said Miss Van Cleve. "In addition to the students that applied for next semester, a number of students unable to participate next semester indicated interest for the future," she said. Thursday, three members of the ASUN exchange pro-

gram committee and Russell Brown, associate dean of student affairs, will meet with the applicants to discuss the program, said Miss Van Cleve, Brown will then hold individual conferences with the applicants to de-

termine how they would respond in various situations, she added

The committee will choose two students and two alternates for the program, according to Miss Van Cleve. These students must meet the 2.5 grade average requirement to be eligible but they may be any year in school, she said

Miss Van Cleve said that a proposal is now before the University Regents asking them to waive tuition for the exchange students coming to Nebraska.

Mrs. Bona said that the Selleck residence halls were built in 1954, which makes estoncampus

their food service the oldest on campus.

'The cafeteria needed to be brought up to date," she said.

We serve about 830 students a day, she said, which includes the athletes. Mrs. Bona explained that the athletes have a separate serving line, which has also been remodeled.

'The athletes receive the same food as the other students." said Miss Wegner, "but they get more quantity and more meat."

SAME FOOD She said that renovations will be made in a few of the pieces of equipment in the kitchen and serving line next month.

'We also have new dishes, which are in a pattern called Amber Gold," Miss Wegner said. "The new dishes and the new look of the cafeteria help the atmosphere, she continued, "which is physychologically beneficial."




