### Cipriano hopes Wildcat contest is 'interesting'

Coach Joe Cipriano's Husker's take on the Kansas State Wildcats from Manhattan Saturday night before a Coliseum crowd that had made the game an SRO affair by Wednesday.

While there are still many crucial games left for any of the four or five teams still with a shot at the conference title, this contest has to be labeled a "must" for Nebraska if the Cornhuskers want to maintain their advantage of momentum they now enjoy in the tight race.

Cip's crew lost their first two loop outings against the two teams they are now tied with for the league lead—Iowa State and Kansas State. They since have rebounded for five straight wins, including an important sweep of the with for the league lead—two Oklahoma schools on the road, a feat the Wildcat's failed to pull off and a trip Kansas, just behind the leaders, has yet to make.

Wildcat coach Tex Winter voices great respect for Nebraska: "They've got the inside track in the conference

race. Especially since they beat Oklahoma State and Oklahoma on the road. That was a big weekend for them."

## Trackmen open at home

Track fans can see their first home meet of the season Saturday as the Husker thinclads meet the Oklahoma State Cowboys at 1:30 p.m. in Memorial Stadium.

Coach Frank Sevine foresees a close race in the 880 as Oklahoma State's Steve Gerkin will meet Husker Don Morran who has the fastest time in the conference so far this year with a 1:53.4.

### Pole vault close

The pole vault will also be a close event according to the coach, as the Cowboy's veteran Larry Curtis will meet Boyd Epley who is a transfer to Nebraska.

Sevine is relishing the prospects of "a very good middle distance group — the best we've had from an overall standpoint in recent years."

He applied this same tag to his quarter mile crew of Clifton Forbes, Larry Frost, John Mottley and John Simmons.

### Also in sprints

Forbes and Mottley will also be seen in the sprints where they will be assisted by football player Mike Green, veteran Larry Liss, former Grant prep ace Bill Daiss and Bob Wilson, a junior college transfer.

Tabbed for duty in the 880, the 600 and the 1,000 are Les Hellbush, Morran and Mike Randall. Neil Knolle and Greg Young will compete in the half mile and Hugh McGovern and Ron Lee will be the entries in the 600.

Sevine's new assistant, Dean Brittenham, is the Husker's field events skipper and shares Sevine's opinion that

the Scarlet and Cream will be improved.

### More competitive

"It looks like we'll be more competitive in the long jump, with three 23-footers in Lennox Burgher, Randall Jones and Joe Orduna," Brittenham says. "And we have some fine individuals in Dennis Hagin (shot put), Steve Krebs and Jack Todd (high jump) and Epley and Terry Medjo (pole vault)."

Orduna will also be seen in

the hurdles along with Dave Kuddron, Lonnie Sherlock and Fred Nicholl.

## Borgialli's best season cinched by wrestling win

Nebraska won five straight matches after dropping behind 11-3 to register a 20-11 win over Ft. Hays (Kan.) State at the Coliseum Thursday night.

The win insured Coach Orval Borgialli his winningest season since he came to Nebraska three years ago as head wrestling coach. His record this season is 4-7-1.

The only pin of the meet came in the 137 weight class where Larry Tepley lost to his Hays State opponent in 4:03.

Tepley usually wrestles 115. "We just don't have anyone on the team who weights 137," Borgialli said.

When the Huskers won, they really won. Ron Thon scored 15-0 against his opponent, Richard Kerr 16-4 and Harry Gaylor 13-0.
