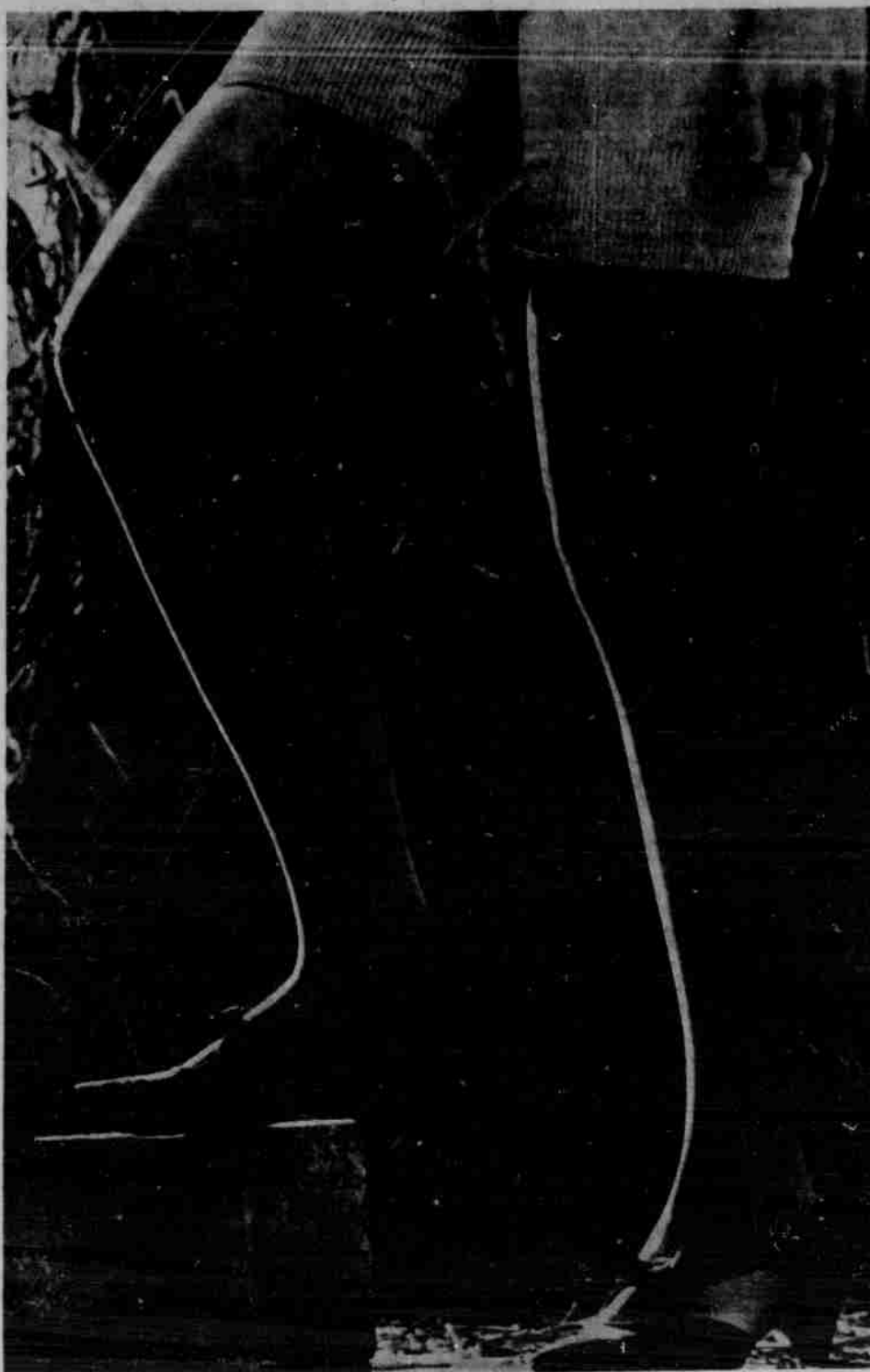
**THE WINNER** will be chosen strictly on the basis of her legs, Miss Ramsey continued. Voting will take place all next week in the Nebraska Union.

University of Nebraska Regents made three administrative appointments in the College of Arts and Sciences Friday.

Dr. John W. Robinson, professor of English, was named associate dean of the College, effective July 15, 1969, succeeding Dr. Robert L. Hough who asked to return to full-time teaching and research in the English department.

Dr. Harry L. Weaver, assistant dean of the College since 1963, was named associate dean of the College, effective Dec. 1.

**DR. NICHOLAS** Babchuk, professor of sociology, was named chairman of the department of sociology, effective Jan. 27, 1969, succeeding Dr. Alan Bates who asked to return to full-time teaching and research.

Dean Weaver joined the University faculty in 1946 as instructor of botany. He was named assistant professor in 1947, associate professor in 1949, professor in 1959 and assistant dean in 1963.

Dr. Robinson joined the University's English department in 1964 as an associate professor and was elevated to professor in 1967. A native of London, England, he holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from University College at Oxford, England and a Ph.D. from the University of Glasgow.

**HE RECEIVED** a Woods Faculty Fellowship in 1964 and is the author of two books: "English Theatrical Literature, 1559-1900: Bibliography" and "Sixteenth Century Street Ballads About the Theatre." He has been commissioned to write two volumes on Shakespearean drama.

Dr. Babchuk joined the University faculty in 1959 as an associate professor of sociology and was named professor in 1963. He served as acting chairman of the department in the spring of 1966.

During 1967-68 he received Woods Faculty Fellowship in the Humanities to study in Italy and a University Research Council Fellowship to do research in Italy. President-elect of the Midwest Sociological Society, he holds B.A. and M.A. degrees from Wayne University in Detroit and a Ph.D. from Washington University in St. Louis.
