

NU cagers face tough foes

For the most part, an athletic unit (with the exception of Ohio State's 1969 football team) proves its value by the quality of competition it plays.

If such is the case, then Nebraska basketball coach Joe Cipriano feels his Huskers have the pre-conference opportunity to prove how really successful they want to be.

Nebraska's cagers, for instance, will tackle two prospective national powers before Christmas: Duquesne Dec. 9 in Lincoln and Houston Dec. 12 in the Bluebonnet Classic in the Astrodome.

Duquesne may provide the most formidable Husker basketball opponent since 1966 when Nebraska upset the country's top-ranked Michigan team on an

unorthodox, behind-the-back scoop shot by Fred Hare.

"We'll have our hands full," Cip says of Duquesne, who finished with a 20-4 record and an NCAA Tournament berth last season. The Dukes, paced by junior sensation Jarrett Durham, return most of last year's personnel.

True's Basketball Yearbook tabs Duquesne to finish as the nation's ninth best college team this season. The Dukes boast a pair of standouts in 6-9 twins Barry and Garry Nelson.

"Houston also is picked to have one of its best teams," Cip acknowledges. "They have a lot of players back and should be a real challenging assignment for us."

Houston's Dwight Davis is mentioned by many national magazines as being one of the country's top five

sophomores this season. Texas A&M and Kent State (Ohio) also are included in the 4-team Bluebonnet Classic field. Texas A&M captured the Southwestern Conference championship last season and returns two starters, including 7-foot center Steve Niles.

Houston is regarded as the best independent team in the Southwest. Although the Cougars graduated Ken Spain, George Reynolds and Theodis Lee, they return leading scorer Ollie Taylor. They also expect a big contribution from junior college grad Poo Welch, a 1968 jaycee all-American who averaged 29.8 points per game.

The competitive quality continues in the Big Eight Conference Holiday Basketball Tournament in Kansas City in late December. The Huskers drew defending

conference champion Colorado, which incidentally, will have its entire starting lineup back from a year ago.

Lambert to speak on campus

Thomas F. Lambert, Jr., editor-in-chief of the American Trial Lawyers Association, will speak Thursday at the first Law College Convocation for 1969-1970. He will address students and faculty on "Advocacy: Art of Artifice."

A luncheon at the Nebraska Union will follow the convocation. The gathering has been arranged by the Dis-

tinguished Lecturer Committee to give law students an opportunity to talk directly with Lambert. Tickets for the luncheon are available from members of the committee.

Lambert became editor-in-chief in 1955. He was selected by Dean Roscoe Pound to succeed him in that position. Prior to his work with the American Trial Lawyers As-

sociation, Lambert was professor of law at Boston University School of Law.

From 1940 to 1942, he was professor of law, later dean, at John B. Stetson College of Law, De Land, Fla. At 25, he was the youngest dean of a law school in the history of American legal education. He is a member of the District of Columbia bar.
