however, may warrant modification of these procedures upon recommendation of the Chancellor or the Corporation Secretary.

Public hearing

There will be a public hear-

ing on the proposed new policy Jan. 10, 1970, the day of the next Regents meeting. The proposed new policy represents a change in Regents bylaws and cannot become effective without public notice, a hearing and a 30 day waiting period.

Related to the merger of the

University of Omaha with the University of Nebraska, the Regents approved a general set of policy guidelines.

—All campus entities of the University should form a coordinated totality with complementary rather than competitive units.

—Unnecessary duplication within the total University is to be avoided.

—The University of Nebraska at Omaha should preserve and nurture its unique characteristics resulting from its urban setting and its special concern for the part-time, evening student and the commuting student.

—Cooperative programs, adapting the special talents of faculty and staff, as well as specialized facilities on all

campuses, are to be encouraged.

Common interest

—Certain services and facilities of common interest to all campuses are to be coordinated by the central administration.

—Graduate instruction at the doctoral level shall be the responsibility of a single graduate faculty, with an executive dean of graduate education presiding.

—A maximum of day to day procedural independence should be afforded the individual campus units, subject to established central policies.

—The quality of educational programs on all of the campuses should be comparable

within limitations imposed by the differences in program functions and program missions.

—Conformity of institutional organization and mission is not necessarily desired; expanded and improved service to the public is.

—Statements of general policy adopted by the Regents should be applicable to all segments of the institution.


