Peace symbol

The peace symbol is not a peace symbol, says the Cornhusker Republican Women's Club. They describe it as the "essence of strife and revolution instead of peace."

"In the Middle Ages the broken cross within a circle was an anti-christian symbol worn by people who were op-posed to Christianity," said Mrs. Earl Luff, spokesman for the club.

The group received their information from the Nebraska Republican Women's Club and the Sandusky Courier, she said. "We believe that youth has been misinformed about the meaning of the symbol," Mrs. Luff said.

"We are opposed to the symbol simply because it has nothing at all to do with peace.

The group's statement has caused so much commotion that the club intends to research the youth movement, Mrs. Luff said.

The peace symbol has meant different things throughout the ages. To the Indians, it was a combination of the two symbols for man and fire and actually meant death by fire.

In the 1950's the broken cross was the symbol of the ban the bemb movement in England. If worn with the fork up, the symbol meant bilateral disarmament and when worn with the fork down, it symbolized unilateral disarma-

Mrs. Luff admitted that the Club was ignorant of this past history of the peace symbol.

"The true meaning of the peace symbol should be exposed because people should see both sides of the peace movement," Mrs. Luff stressed. "We're not against peace," she added, "we just don't want Peace at Any Price."
