

Constitution amendments

The following are proposed amendments to the ASUN Constitution and the Home Economics Advisory Board Consti-

tution that will appear on the ballot of the April 22 ASUN elections.

Proposed amendments to the

Serendipity 70 in home ec

"Serendipity 70" is the theme of the annual home economics career day for high school students which will be held Saturday on East Campus.

"We hope girls will discover the excitement and opportunities available through home economics," according to Janet Kuchera, student chairman.

The theme "Serendipity" is taken from an Persian folk tale about three princes who made a happy, valuable discovery "and this is what we hope Nebraska girls will do on Hospitality Day," she said.

Career day is offered to provide high school girls with an opportunity to learn about home economics as a profession.

Home economics majors are planning exhibits in food and nutrition; textiles, clothing and design; human development and management and home

economics and journalism.

Faculty and students will answer questions and explain curriculum and career opportunities.

A fashion show featuring boutique creations designed and made by home economics students will be held and a tour of the Ruth Staples Child Development Laboratory is also planned.

ASUN Constitution concerning the ASUN Senate:

A. To strike part C., Article VII, Section 1., which reads "To enact regulations, ordinances, statements of policy, and other legislation of the Association by simple majority, provided that at least two-thirds (2-3) majority of the members are present and voting."

B. To add a new part C., Article VII, Section 1., to read: "To enact regulations, ordinances, statements of policy, and other legislation of the Association by simple majority of those voting a quorum being present."

II.

A. To strike part F., Article VII, Section 1., which reads "To adopt recommendations concerning affairs which effect the University at large by simple majority, provided that at least two-thirds (2-3) of the members vote, and to present these recommendations to the University official concerned."

III.

A. To add a part P. to Article VII, Section 1., to read: "A quorum shall be three-fifths (3-5) of the entire voting membership."

B. To add a part Q. to Article VII, Section 1., to read: "In all articles of the ASUN Constitution the words 'entire voting membership' shall mean those

members found on the rolls at the time of the vote."

(The proposed ASUN amendments to be ratified must be approved by a majority vote with at least thirty percent of the eligible students voting in the election, or by an affirmative vote of fifteen percent of the eligible voters when less than thirty percent of the eligible students vote.)

Proposed amendment to the Home Economics Advisory Board Constitution:

To add subdivision A to Section 3 of Article III concerning membership which will read as follows: "If the elected representative from Home Economics Education is in her professional semester during her term of office, she may appoint with the approval of the board, another Home Economics Education major to serve as a substitute. This appointed member would serve as a liaison between the elected member, the board and the Home Economics Education majors."

(The proposed Home Economics Advisory Board amendment to be ratified must be approved by a majority vote of the total enrollment in the School of Home Economics with at least thirty percent of the eligible students voting or by the affirmative vote of fifteen percent of the eligible voters when less than thirty percent of the eligible students vote.)

Demos attend state convention

About 15 students and faculty members from the University of Nebraska are expected to attend the State Young Democrats' Convention, according to Mike Jacobs, YD president.

The annual convention will be held in Grand Island April 17-19 at the Hotel Yancey, Jacobs said.

National President of the Young Democratic Clubs of America David Sternoff, will deliver the keynote address.

After two days of convention work, the delegates plan to reassemble to decide which Democratic candidates to endorse before the primary contest.
