

# Quarrie races Gray in Drake sprint test

Nebraska sprinter Don Quarrie has been winding up all season for a chance at the open 100-yard dash.

He'll get that chance Friday and Saturday in the Drake Relays at Des Moines after being committed to relay appearances at Texas and Kansas.

QUARRIE ALSO will be assigned to the 400 and sprint medley relays as the Cornhusker track team sets its sights on its first relay title on the major circuit's last meet.

NU track coach Frank Sevigne is confident of the Jamaica freshman's ability after creditable times in his first major outdoor relay tests.

"We didn't want to rush him early in the season, and he was busy enough with the relay work," Sevigne explains about Quarrie's later open start than other top sprinters.

Sevigne, however, believes Quarrie will be competitive against the elite sprinters. "Without question, he has the potential to become one of the great sprinters of the world," Sevigne says.

Presumably, Quarrie will need his peak effort one week earlier to challenge Missouri football speedster Mel Gray, who annexed both the Texas and Kansas 100 titles.

LARRY HIGHBAUGH and Mike Goodrich, a pair of Indiana sprinters who finished second and third, respectively, in the Drake field last year, join Gray, whose :09.4 clocking won last year.

The Husker coach says the four-mile quartet of Mel Campbell, Pete Brang, Mike Lee and Greg Carlberg are capable of bagging the Drake title after recording the country's third fastest time in the event at Kansas.

"Campbell may have been close to his potential, but the other three still have room for improvement," Sevigne says.
