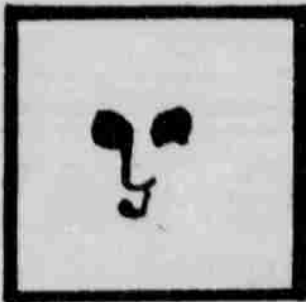
Category: Best Actor
