Summer orientation will begin Monday

The University of Nebraska will host a summer orientation program for incoming freshmen and their parents beginning Monday, June 15 at the Nebraska Union.

Sessions, 1½ days long for each group, will last through August 6. About 5,000 registration forms have been sent out and Ron Eaglin, coordinator of the summer program, estimates that as many as 3,000 will participate throughout the summer.

The program is designed in two parts, one for parents and the other for students. It offers students an opportunity to counsel with faculty representatives, to learn more about University life and a chance to ask some remaining questions. The program is designed to give parents a chance to understand University aims and a chance to meet and talk with faculty, administrators and upperclass students. Both parents and prospective students

will meet together for an administrative roundtable discussion the first day of their session. After this joint session, parents will meet at various times throughout the day with college representatives, counseling center personnel and the student hosts of the program. In addition, they will learn some of the history of the University as well as participate in a study skills program.

The first-day schedule for students includes a getting-acquainted session, health examinations, a study skills session and individual meetings with college representatives.

The following day students and parents will meet jointly to hear presentations from University Housing Services and student government, and to learn some of the innovations of the University.

Students and their parents will be staying in the University's Pound Hall residence hall.
