

Horse course is racy subject

Juniors and seniors with \$50 and an interest in horses can take a new course in horses and riding second semester.

Animal Science 115, or "Light Horse Production and Equitation," will include working with horses the last 8 to 10 weeks, according to R. B. Warren.

The \$50 lab fee covers horse and equipment rental and insurance, Warren said. The university has no horses and must rent them from a local stable.

A population explosion in horses, from 3.4 million in 1959 to about 8 million today, has

brought about a demand for the course, the former Michigan State instructor said. "Horses are the number one livestock competition in the U.S.," he said, "and 4,600 Nebraska 4H members own horses."

The course will cover managing, feeding, housing, breeding, shoeing and riding, Warren said. He is a nationally approved American Horse Show Association senior registered judge.

Near the end of the semester, he said, intra-class equitation, or riding competitions will be held. The equitation training

includes saddle, blanket, stirrup and rein adjustment, grooming, riding positions, types of gait, basic dressage movements, and some advanced riding and jumping.

Safety precautions and care of the horse after riding will be included, Warren said.

He has judged some of the largest horse shows in the country in the Quarter-horse, Appaloosa, Arabian and Cutting Horse divisions. Warren coaches some of the University livestock judging teams and is Vice-President of the National Block and Bridle Club.
