

Cornhuskers corral Cowboys, 68-63

Laramie, Wyo. — Nebraska's Cornhuskers, jinxed from the free throw line during the first half, turned timely second half charity tosses into a 68-63 win over the University of Wyoming here Tuesday night.

It was the season opener for both clubs.

Nebraska cashed in on only one of eight free throws in the first half, but scored its final five points from the free throw line to insure the five-point win over the Cowboys.

The Huskers, who led for nearly all the game, saw a six-point halftime lead diminish to a 61-60 advantage with 4:30 remaining in the game. But Leroy Chalk, who didn't score in the first half, potted a fielder with four minutes remaining and added a pair of charity tosses 57 seconds later to give the Huskers a 65-60 lead.

Guard Marvin Stewart added another point from the freethrow line and Nebraska led 66-61 with 1:10 showing on the clock. The Cowboys were forced to play desperation basketball and the Huskers managed to run down the clock before Al Nissen dropped in a pair of free throws with 28 seconds left for the final score of the game.

Nebraska scored seven points during the final four minutes while the Cowboys could manage only three.

Nebraska coach Joe Cipriano was pleased with the win. He was especially pleased winning in Wyoming — a place where the Cowboys lost only one of 13 outings last season.

"Opening with a win on the road should do us a world of good," said Cipriano. "Although our board play was at times spasmodic, I feel we played a good first game and had some good clutch shooting."

Cipriano offered special applause for Stewart. The senior

guard, bothered with a knee injury, canned nine field goals and added four free throws for 22 points.

Chuck Jura followed in scoring for the Huskers with 18 tallies. "Marvin (Stewart) and Chuck (Jura) both played fine basketball," offered Cip. "And I'm sure they'll keep on improving."

Cipriano also pointed out the

play of guard Al Nissen. The 6-2 junior from Miller, S.D., has not been playing up to par this season and sat on the bench as sophomore Tom Gregory got the starting nod.

But Nissen came off the bench and played the entire second half scoring eight points. "Nissen did a great job controlling the ball," said

Cipriano. "He took charge when we were holding the ball late in the game."

Nebraska used only seven players in the contest.

Nebraska opens its home season Saturday against the University of Iowa. Game time

is 7:35 p.m. in the Coliseum.
