prisoners of war returned is to end the war. '

As part of an effort to reincarnate the peace movement in Nebraska the Free Speech Movement has established a permanent "peace committee." Members say the purpose is to promote a "peace consciousness and to remind people that the war they opposed last year is still going on."

The committee plans a program featuring speakers, films and music in January. If the money can be raised they may put out a calendar showing important dates in the peace movement and pictures of war victims.


The Movement has started a "people's Lbrary" and is working on a project to provide cheap food. Called the "Food Conspiracy," its organizers plan to purchase food in bulk quantities for resale to Lincolnites at below retail prices.

Barret also noted that even though some Free Speech members have written for the Informer it is not an organ of the group. The Informer is a weekly news and information sheet.

Barret is unconcerned with the size of membership in the Free Speech Movement. In his opinion Nebraskans aren't interested in "large politicaltype" groups.
