Huskers begin preparation today for Orange Bowl date

After a 19-day layoff, Nebraska's Orange Bowl-bound **Cornhuskers** begin preparation today for a date with fifthranked Louisiana State.

A half-dozen writers and sportscasters from Louisiana



will visit the Lincoln campus today to watch the opening of the Cornhusker drills. They'll be visiting with players and coaches.

Although the Huskers have had a layoff since the Oklahoma game, regularly scheduled conditioning workouts have been held on the AstroTurf.

At the same time, Nebraska's coaching staff has been searching across the nation for possible Husker recruits. And several of the top prep grid players in the country will be visiting Cornhusker workouts the next week.

In addition will be several junior college transfers. Visiting this week will be defensive linemen John Bell of **Cypress Junior College and Dave Gleason of Orange Coast** Junior College. Tony Bonwell, a defensive back from Golden West Junior College, will also visit the Lincoln campus.

The Cornhuskers will work out in Lincoln until Dec. 24 when they will depart for Miami.

Football News calls Devaney top coach

According to N e b r a s k a 's super sophomore Johnny Rodgers, the Cornhuskers have had something big going for "Coach them this year. Devaney has done it all," says Johnny.

And Wednesday the Husker boss was honored for his accomplishments by being named National Coach of the Year by Football News. He had previously been named Big Eight Coach of the Year by both Associated Press and **United Press International.**

"The reason we keep winning is because of coach Devaney," assured Rodgers. "He's just got something in him that makes you want to play hard for him."
