This committee serves as publisher of the *Nebraskan* and *Cornhusker* and authorizes the existence and operation of any publication financed entirely or partially by student fees.

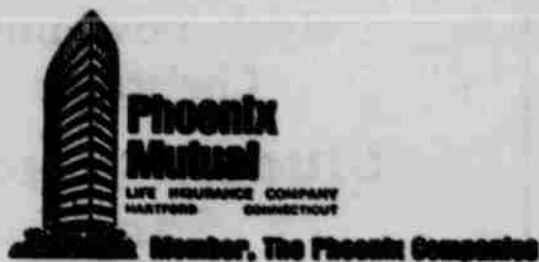
