

Center has films for instruction

Businesses in Nebraska and other midwestern states are making increasing use of in-service training films provided through the University's Instructional Media Center.

The media center, located in Nebraska Hall, has one of the nation's outstanding collection of films and supporting material in the areas of management development; supervisory and sales training;

and employee communication, motivation and productivity, according to James G. Buterbaugh, the center's head.

"In addition to having one of the best collections of any business film library, our goal is to have plenty of prints to meet the needs of firms which want to use them," Buterbaugh said.

The media center began developing its collection of business in-service training materials about two years ago. This summer it hosted a Media Festival designed to bring the University's services to the attention of businessmen.

"The festival and other efforts are leading to more frequent visits from company executives charged with training and to more requests for information about our film library and services," Buterbaugh said.

In addition, University faculty members in management use the center's materials in conducting classes in communities throughout the state, he said.

The center now has a catalogue of what's available in the "Reel World of Business and Industry."

It lists the films available by

subject matter area, describes the length, gives a synopsis of the film and states its rental cost.

For most films there is a leader's guide. Some have accompanying printed materials or study kits for the students.

"We will be happy to send the catalogue to firms who ask for it and we are more than willing to discuss use of these films with persons charged with carrying on educational programs for their businesses," Buterbaugh said.
