Nebraska runs by CU, 80-42

Colorado's world class hurdler Marcus Walker and pole vaulter Dave Bussabarger set stadium and meet records here Saturday, but that was the extent of CU's celebration as Nebraska loped to an easy 80-42 victory.

Walker, with three wins over world record holder Willie Davenport in the last two weeks, streaked to a 7.1 clocking while team mate Bussabarger erased Tom Porter's old standard with a 16-1 vault.

Cornhusker sophomore Hopeton Gordon cracked the school, meet and stadium records in the long jump with a leap of 24-10. The old standard was 24-8 set in 1969 by N. S. Hurd

Nebraska's only double winner was senior co-captain Greg Carlberg who continues to dominate every race he runs. After a relaxed 4:19 mile, he returned to capture the 1000 from teammates Jim Hawkins and Dan Speck.

With Colorado out of the way, Nebraska's sights turn toward Houston, Tex., and the USTFF meet in the Astrodome.

One runner who is especially looking forward to the weekend is Carlberg. He's entered in the mile and will receive his first competitive challenge of the season.

Headlining the event is Marty Liquori, NCAA Outdoor

mile champion in 1969 and 1970. Liquori has a 3:54.1 to his credit and will be joined by fellow four-minute-milers Dave Wottle of Bowling Green (3:59) and Villanova's Chris Mason (3:59.9).

Devaney was given a \$2,300 raise, boosting his annual salary to \$32,000. He was also given a two-year extension as football coach.




