colleges to rely more heavily on government money, returns from investments and alumni support. Recently these three sources have not kept pace with the needs of higher education while inflation has reduced the value of the dollar.

The prospects for higher education are not bright. The Carnegie Commission on Higher Education recently estimated that two-thirds of the nation's schools were either in financial trouble or headed for it.
