Paolo Soleri considers himself outside of the mainstream of social and political activity - but running parallel to it
During a slide show and discussion session Tuesday afternoon he presented his concept for a new type of city which condenses everything nto one gigantic superstructure.
An architect and former student of Frank Lloyd Wright Soleri came to the University as part of the World in Revolution Conference.

On an 800 acre area outside of Scottsdale, Ariz., Soleri and his students, about 200 of them, work, draw and build. dwellings. The community is self-supporting and makes ceramics and other objects which they sell.
Soleri said he settled in Arizona somewhat by accident. He was born in Italy and came over to the United States to work for Frank Lloyd Wright, who was at the time in Arizona.
His working association with Wright terminated because he felt he could do
