Physiologist visits zoology

An internationally known Illinois physiologist will visit the University this week under auspices of the department of zoology's Distinguished Scientist Lecture Series.

C. Ladd Prosser, professor in the department of physiology and biophysics at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, has served on the NASA Space Biology Advisory Subcommittee since 1967.

He has recently returned from a scientific expedition to the Galapagos Island on Scripps Oceanographic Institute's research vessel.

Prosser will confer during the week with students, graduate students and faculty. He is the past president of the American Physiological Society and the American Society of Zoologists and the author of more than 75 scientific papers.
