**Taxes and Children on ETV**

Taxes, children and Julius Caesar are the subjects of some of the special programs to be presented this week on the Nebraska Educational Television Network.

Anyone who has ever filed a tax return will want to be watching tonight at 8:00 p.m. when stations present "The Advocates." Advocates Howard Miller and William Rusher will present the pros and cons of one of the season's more controversial questions, "Should capital gains be taxed as ordinary income?"

Mr. Miller will present the case against current tax law and will call as one of his witnesses Philip Stern, author of *The Great Treasure Raid*. Stern favors higher taxes on capital gains, calling the present low rate "a euphoric bubble built precariously, disproportionately favors the wealthy."

Advocate Rusher will support the present system, asserting that preferential rates encourage investment in new businesses and permit greater flow of money into industries offering higher prospective returns.

One of the major highlights of the NETN broadcast week comes Thursday, June 17 at 6:00 p.m. That's when Danny Kaye, UNICEF's roving ambassador to the children of the world, will host an hour-long global program, "The Children of the World," focusing on the creativity of young people.

Celebrating the 15th anniversary of the United Nation's Children's Fund, Kaye will broadcast from UN headquarters in New York. NETV will produce the U.S. segment of the international broadcast.

Viewers won't want to go too far away from their television sets after the Danny Kaye special, because at 10:30 p.m. they'll be able to watch the annual NEBRASKA Aland Parade. The parade, scheduled earlier in the day in North Platte, will be recorded by KOLN-TV, Lincoln-Grand Island, and will be simulcast for audiences throughout the state by the Nebraska ETV Network.

The week ends on a note of high drama Saturday at 8:00 p.m. as the "NETI Playhouse: Biography" series presents the BBC production of "Julius Caesar."

The play is Shakespeare's historical tragedy about the conspiracy to murder Caesar, the great statesman-warrior of Rome, and the conflict following his assassination which ended in the conspirator's deaths.

Maurice Denham stars as Caesar, with Robert Stephens as Marc Antony, Frank Finlay as Brutus and Edward Woodward as Cassius.
