

You can win Memorial Stadium for a day

The winner of an October Nebraska Easter Seal Society raffle will own Nebraska's Memorial Stadium for the Colorado-Nebraska football game Oct. 30.

According to UNL Easter Seal volunteers Tom McCown and Laurel Gerlach, the winner will get two tickets to that game, a football autographed by the Cornhusker players and coaches, and may get to meet the team.

The Nebraska Easter Seal Society says it will use the money obtained from the sale of the \$1 raffle tickets to help build a new resident camp near Seward for handicapped children and adults.

McCown says it's a good community program since the money is going to be spent in Nebraska. He said tickets are being sold state-wide.

The Society says it has used temporary camp facilities for the past four years that were built for people who can walk up long flights of stairs, who are not greatly inconvenienced by a bathroom which is 500

yards from their cabins, and to whom a narrow doorway is not an obstacle.

Handicapped people, on the other hand, often cannot do these things and must struggle to overcome many unnecessary obstacles every day, the

Society says.

McCown said raffle tickets will be on sale for the next four weeks from a booth in the Nebraska Union. He said the booth will be open on Thursday and Friday before away football games and on

Friday and Saturday before home games.

Laurel Gerlach said two Lincoln high schools and some Lincoln businesses are selling the tickets as well as sororities and fraternities.

"Even though Beta Sigma Psi and Kappa Sigma are selling the tickets, we need many

more volunteers," McCown said.

Heussman said, explaining his feeling that this apparent concern by the students, may do as much for the library in the long run as an on-rush of homecoming donations."

He said he believes Nebraska citizens should strive for a good library because 1) direct services like the Regional Library centers allow out-state residents to get books from the library in Lincoln, 2) "when a state puts money in its educational system at any level, it stands to gain a great deal," and 3)

"Business tends to go where there's good research (thus, good research libraries)."

Howard Norland, assoc. professor of English at UNL and chairman of the Faculty Senate Library Committee said he is "delighted" with the students' gesture.

"It may dramatize to the state that this is truly a Nebraska resource and the only research library in the state," he said.

Norland said he acknowledges that public citizens often dislike research activities at Universities but pointed out that seven of the nine wheat varieties grown in Nebraska were developed at the University
