THE EVENTS of the story involve a series of characters who set Hoffman up to expose a list of Georgie's characteristics. This rather modest ambition is accomplished, but I don't think it's enough.

Hoffman's performance is a fine, restrained, show-case of his talents. A brief vignette by Barbara Harris provides a neat spark of life, but it's a kind of solo performance with another actor on the set. Everyone else holds up his lamp to illuminate Hoffman.

That is apparently what they were hired to do.
