

still held to a maximum of six hours, and events have to be registered in advance with the Residence Director and must still be supervised.

However, the new proposal allows the activities to be individually oriented, eliminating the necessity to plan group activities; allows student government officers to supervise; and includes no reference as to whether the door of individual rooms should be open or closed.

Some of Kuncl's suggestions conflict with current policy since the Regent's rejected an attempt to broaden supervision to include student government

officers and have insisted that the doors be kept open during RHA Hours, said CSL member Ely Meyerson, interim Dean of Student Affairs.

Students told the Council that there is talk of an illegal "mass migration" where the dorms would no longer be segregated by sex, and men and women would begin living on the same dormitory floor. By dramatically showing the Regents their opinion on coed visitation, they hope to force the issue.

However, Eldridge cautioned them against such an action and told the students CSL would make a policy statement after meeting with the Regents.
