to know about the "limiting" effects of the law.

In the project, itself, Perlman said the participants "talk about the implications" of their readings, which include one text and individual trial cases.

Topics have ranged from the Pentagon Papers to environmental controls, Perlman said.

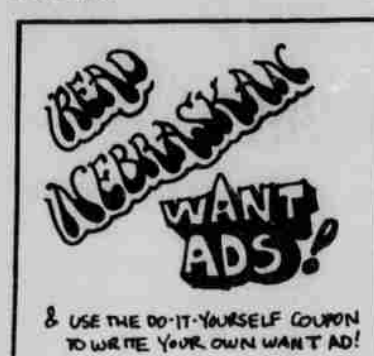
Two students in the CEP course said they see the course as a broad approach to an important issue.

Scott Cooper, a sophomore from Madrid, said he believes "it's a really good thing to find out about something that affects you so closely."

"I'm clarifying my opinions

by discussing them with others," Cooper said. Doug Blomgren described the class discussion as a lot of "what if" questions. The Lincoln sophomore also said he sees the course as "trying to decide with what law should deal."

"We're trying to synthesize a definition of law and it's becoming more and more difficult."
