Berkheim: 'stop parochial thinking'

"We've got to get ourselves together. We've got to stop parochial thinking like 'Go Big Red, I'm a Cornhusker.' Tribalism or communal living is where it's really at. The answer lies in eating, listening to music, talking and getting high together," Dennis Berkheim, World in Revolution Conference chairman and UNL senior, told 100 students Monday in a rap session that concluded the conference on Justice in America.
