**Trotter named  
second-ranked  
administrator**

The University of Nebraska Board of Regents has named Virginia Y. Trotter to the No. 2 post on the UNL campus.

Trotter, formerly dean of the College of Home Economics, was appointed vice-chancellor for academic affairs at the August board meeting.

She replaces C. Peter Maguire, who has accepted the presidency of the State University of New York at Binghamton.

Trotter now heads the general administrative office of the campus, as well as land-grant university activities, and is a member of the National Association of State and Land-Grant Colleges.

Her salary is \$39,000 annually.

Students may be admitted to the Daily Activities, at Nebraska Union, from 8:30 a.m. to 10 p.m. for the remainder of the semester.
