

Student Affairs initiates intern program

The UNL office of Student Affairs announced Wednesday that Administrative Dean Ely Meyerson will coordinate a new program which will ultimately add four student interns to the Student Affairs office staff.

The announcement marks the start of an application process which will hopefully see the students serving as administrative interns by October 2, according to Janet Krause, an intern program organizer.

After applications, and interviews, the students will intern in the Recreation, Counseling Center, Financial Aids, or International Student offices.

These four departments were picked mainly because of the need for student input and their enthusiasm about overseeing an intern, according to Krause.

The internship idea was conceived last spring, and forwarded by former ASUN President Steve Fowler to Meyerson. Funding was approved by Chancellor James Zumbege in July.

Four interns were decided on primarily because of the amount of funds available, Krause said.

Overall objectives for the program are upping student input in the Student Affairs departments and also providing the intern with a concept of the "workings of the University," she said.

The departments hopefully will gain a task force of qualified student workers, and the students will become acquainted with professional ethics, the accountability process and public relations, she added.

For someone not sure of a career choice, she said, it's a chance to "see a staff wrestle" and find out things don't happen tomorrow just because they are good ideas.

The prime objective all the way through, she said, is to make the intern's involvement as meaningful as possible to both the student and the department.

To facilitate this, departments were asked about their plans for on-going evaluations, along with specific descriptions of the interns' position and supervision.

Feedback so far, said Krause, indicates evaluation will be both verbal and written, expressed formally and informally.

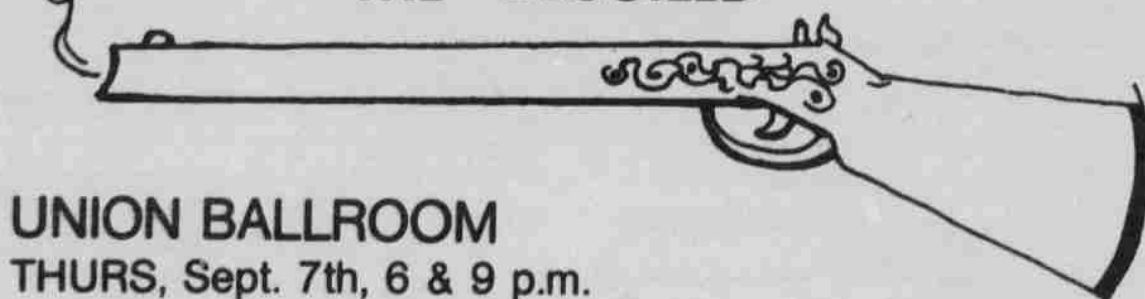

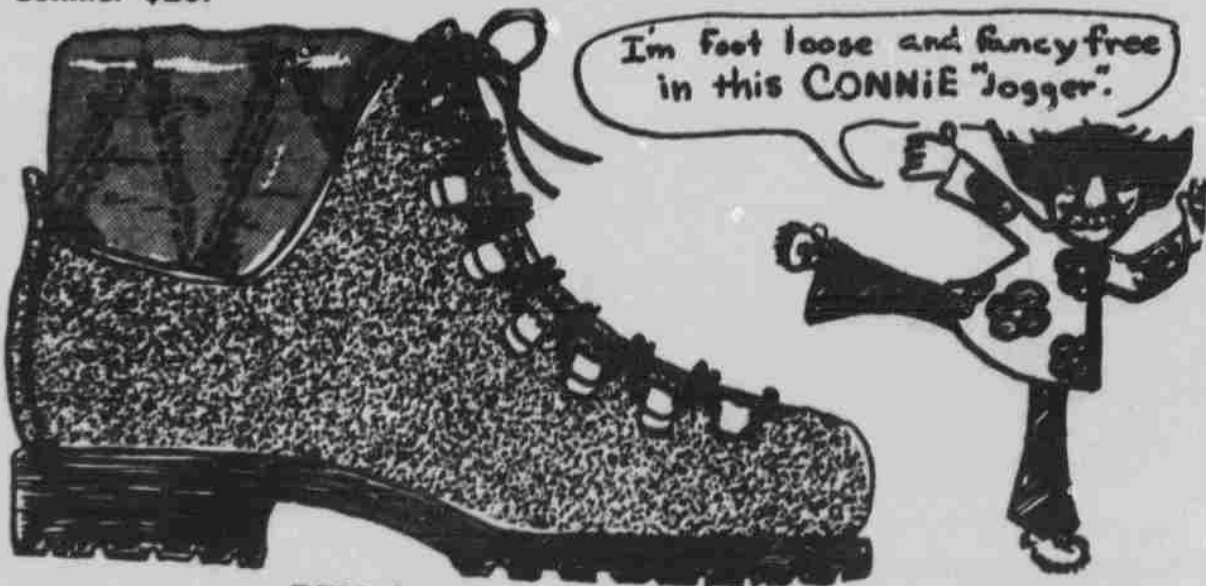
