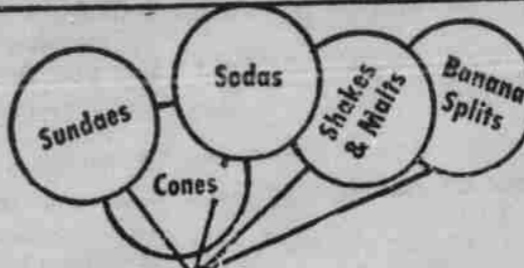

Jazz 'n Java will feature "John Sunshine" Friday from 3:30 to 5 p.m. in the Nebraska Union.

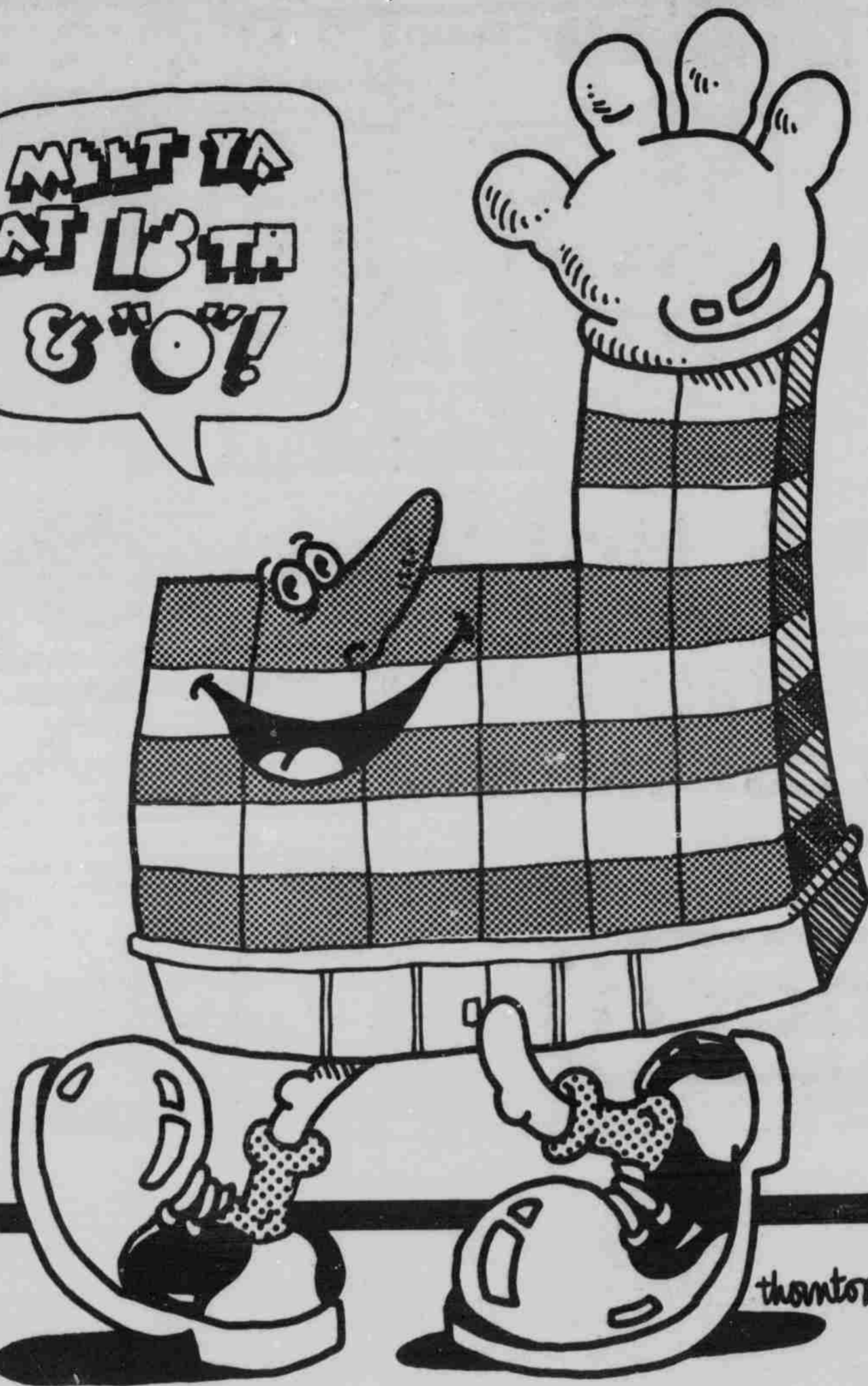

Protest decision expected Friday

Leroy Ramsey, UNL director of minority affairs, said Thursday a decision would be forthcoming within 24 hours on the dispute between ASUN and the black student community over an allegedly racist caricature.

Ramsey said Ken Bader, vice-chancellor for student affairs had "put the matter in my hands." He said he was trying to reach a compromise acceptable to everyone involved.

The caricature, printed in an orientation booklet, was distributed to all incoming UNL freshmen. It set off an incident that culminated last Friday when about a dozen blacks reportedly physically abused ASUN president Bruce Beecher.
