## Space voyages to be as regular as airliners?

The manager of the United States space shuttle program Wednesday night predicted that someday space vehicles would be shot into and returned from space with the regularity of today's airline flights.

"But it'll be a few years down the road yet," Lt. Col. Albert Crews told about 200 persons attending a meeting of the UNL chapter of the American Society of Mechnical Engineers.

Crews said the vehicles used in space shuttle program would be different from today's spacecraft, in that they can be reused.

Eventually, Crews said, the shuttle program might foster cooperation between countries who would be able to exchange payloads via the shuttle system.
