

Persons who would like to help with the second semester PACE drive should contact Karen Richardson at 472-2581 (afternoons).

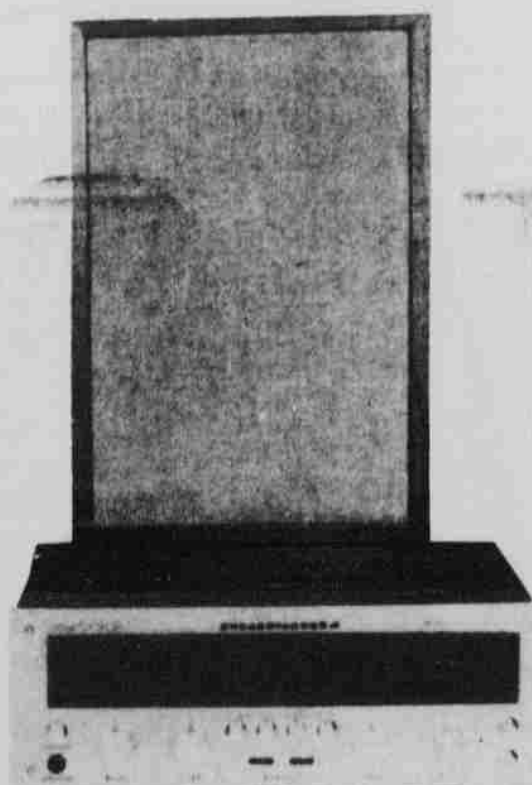
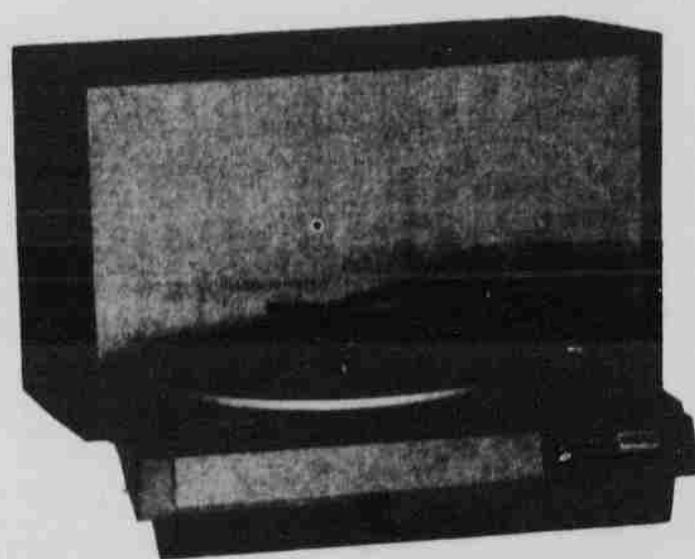
