



# Class to record Sioux language

A small group of UNL students is working on a study of the Lakota Sioux language under the direction of anthropology instructor James Gibson.

The Lakota language traditionally has been passed verbally from generation to generation. The project would attempt to get it into written form.

Gibson said the group of five is attempting to put together a series of lessons like those used in a grammar book for any language course. The project got a boost when two persons speaking Lakota joined.

A potential result of the project is the establishment of a Lakota language extension course, Gibson said.
