Humm—demonstrating poise under pressure

Bob Devaney talked about pressure Tuesday afternoon as the Cornhuskers went through their final major workout before the Oklahoma game.

"Most of our players have played under pressure," Devaney said, referring to several Nebraska players who have been part of the past two national championship teams. "It's got to be an advantage to have people like that when you go into a big game like Oklahoma."

But what about David Humm, the sophomore quarterback with the poise of a veteran? How will he react in a pressure game?

"Humm has been around the past two years and I don't expect him to react badiy to the pressure," Devaney said.

Sure, he's been around the past two years. He was even there in Norman, Okla., last year when the Huskers scored that 35-31 win. But Humm stood on the sidelines eating a hot dog during Nebraska's final touchdown drive. Not much pressure in that.

But David Humm has been under pressure. Real pressure. He didn't enter his sophomore season as just

another sophomore. Folks looked upon him as something special. He was supposed to take over for a quarterback who had just been a first round draft choice of the pros.

"I'm afraid people aren't going to look at me as just a sophomore," Humm said last spring. "People have to realize that I'm an inexperienced quarterbeck. I have to be determined. If things don't go right I have to keep my head."

All-American receiver Johnny Rodgers understood Humm's situation before the season opened.

"Dave may go out there against UCLA and throw a couple of interceptions on our first series of downs," Rodgers said, "but we're gonna get it together. I'm sure Dave is smart enough to realize that it will take time before things start rolling."

Humm did show poise against UCLA, despite

throwing two interceptions. And he showed poise when the Huskers were held scoreless for the first quarter against Kansas and during Nebraska's touchdown march against Iowa State which gave Nebraska a 23-17 lead.

"I've never really felt the pressure like I thought I would," Humm said Tuesday. "I put the situation into perspective. I never lost my confidence. The seniors on this team are real confident and it just rubs off."

But Humm wasn't always sure he could do it.
"I remember watching Tagge on that final drive against Oklahoma last year," Humm said. "I wondered for awhile if I could really do it. I

wondered if I could ever play for Nebraska."

Cornhusker fans have no doubts about Humm's abilities now. He has thrown for 1,869 yards this season. And even when the pressure is there, David Humm will be able to respond. It's really been that way all season.
