



Big Eight dominates ratings

Five Big Eight teams, all headed for post-season bowl action, were rated in the top 20 in this week's Associated Press and United Press International college football polls.

Oklahoma and Nebraska are rated fourth and fifth in each poll and Colorado owns the No. 13 spot in each poll. Missouri is tied for 16th with North Carolina in the UPI poll and is also rated 16th by the AP. Iowa State is 18th in the UPI poll and 17th by AP.

Nebraska received one first place vote from UPI.

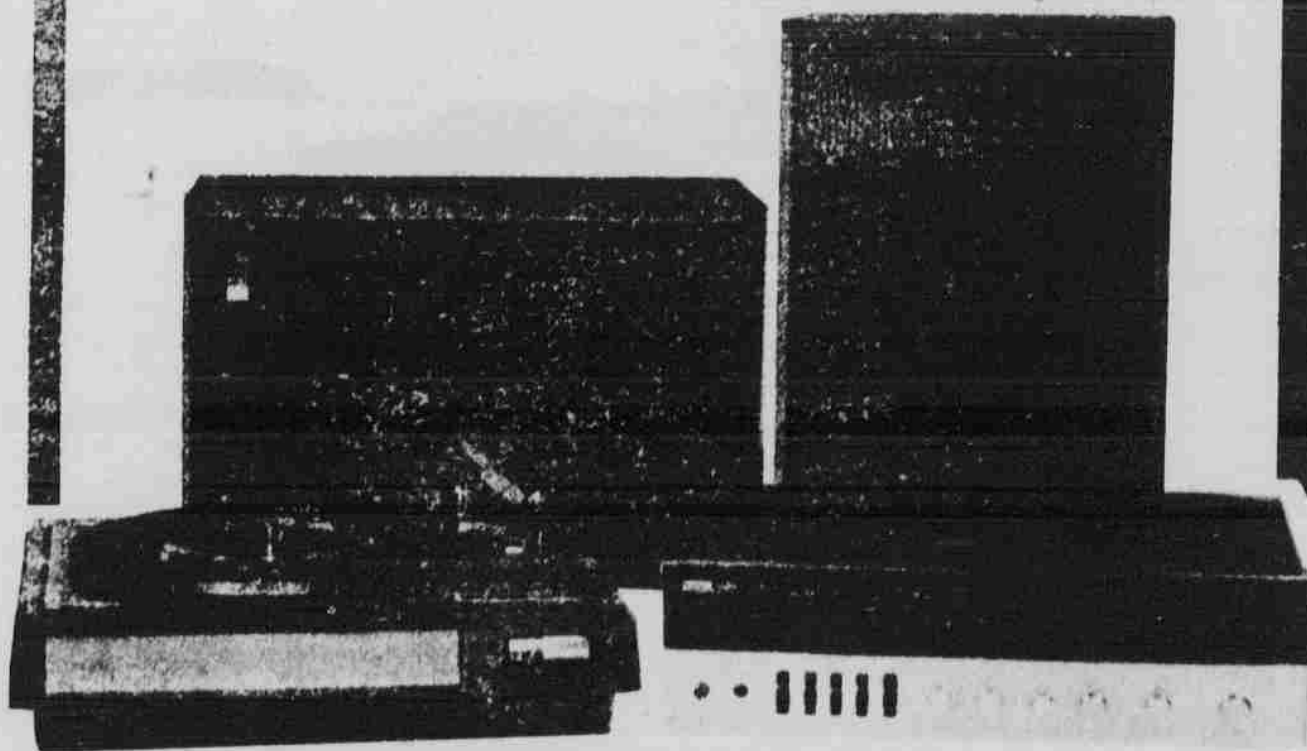
