## RHA committee to solicit student views on alcohol

The RHA committee on alcohol is going the "system route" in its attempts to get consumption of alcohol on campus, okayed, according to Rocky Masson, committee chairman.

The committee meets today to prepare a survey which will be sent to all students in campus housing. The survey will solicit students' views on the subject.

The survey was prepared after talks with representatives from the UNL Housing Office and it will be sent to them before it is distributed to students, to make sure that it covers the subject to their satisfaction.

If the survey results show students favor the idea the results will be included in a proposal to Chancellor James Zumberge, Masson said. Hopefully he will bring the proposal to the regents for consideration next semester, Masson said.

Masson said that, while there have been some "grumblings" in the dormitories at the present policies on alcohol, the students have decided to try working within the system to change the policy.
