construction of a new life sciences building on the UNL campus.

Omaha Sen. Duke Snyder introduced LB 94 which would appropriate \$729,000 to improve the fieldhouse and football field on the UNO campus.

Snyder said he wants to improve the fieldhouse so it can be used for graduation and other activities. Currently, UNO has no place for band practice, ROTC drills or intramural activities, he said.

Snyder said the bill will also improve physical education facilities "not only for students but for the community."

"If I can get everyone eight to 80 to come to the campus, they can see the products, and I won't have to sell' education," Snyder said.

Another Snyder-introduced bill would repeal the "Indian bounty", or payment to counties for jailed Indians. Although he does not oppose subsidizing counties which house Indian prisoners, Snyder said when the state put on an arbitrary quota on imprisonment, it opened hunting season on Indians.

The 1973 Legislature has a long haul ahead of it, if the early controversies are any indicator. And if this session is like those in the past, it may be a long 90 days.
