

## Asian authority to discuss modern China

Lucian Pye, an authority on Asian relations and a professor of political science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will be at UNL today and Tuesday as part of the Phi Beta Kappa Visiting Scholar Program.

Pye, who spent December in the People's Republic of China as a member of the Committee on U.S.-China Relations, will speak at a joint meeting of Sigma Xi and Phi Beta Kappa honorary societies tonight. His topic will be "China Today: The Dynamics of Chinese Domestic Development."

Tuesday Pye is scheduled to meet students in the Olofather Hall lounge at 2 p.m. and 3-30 p.m.

Pye will speak on "The New Phase in U.S.-China Relations" at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday in the Nebraska Union.

He was born in Shansi Province of China and attended the North China American School of Peking; he received a B.A. degree from Carlton College and continued at Yale where he received an M.A. and a Ph.D.

An author, coauthor and editor of several books dealing with foreign relations, Pye is currently the chairman of the committee on comparative politics of the Social Science

Research Council, a member of the board of the Council of Foreign Relations, the Asia Society and the Asia Foundation.

## grice, LaVelle vie for RHA exec posts

Dormitory students have one chance to see and hear the Residence Hall Association (RHA) candidates debate. The election is Tuesday and the debate is tonight at 7 p.m. in Burr Hall.

Carolyn Grice and Gail Watson are running for RHA president and vice president, respectively, against Dennis LaVelle and Orville Roe.

Dormitory students will vote for a presidential and vice presidential slate and a proposed new constitution. Students can vote in their own dormitory in either lunch or dinner lines by showing a meal card.

According to Richard Veed, RHA election commissioner, the new constitution clarifies who are RHA representatives, voting procedure and the eligibility of candidates.

The Grice-Watson platform proposes working with ASUN improve parking throughout the campus, including the paving of the parking lot across from Cather-Pound.

It also proposes cutting the salaries of the RHA president and vice president, which are now \$350 and \$250, respectively, and using the money to pay the RHA treasurer. The treasurer would be responsible for renting RHA refrigerators to students. The rentals are the source of all RHA funds.

Grice and Watson want student assistants (SA's) evaluated in all dormitories and student participation in all SA interviews.

The LaVelle-Roe platform proposes:

- a dormitory guide book containing information on the conveniences offered each dormitory floor.
- an investigation of the dormitory rate increase.
- parking fine appeal board working with ASUN.
- mailing parking stickers in the summer to preregistered students.

Both parties' candidates said they want to work closely with ASUN and are in favor of the alcohol on campus and liberalized visitation proposals.
