Not exactly, but for the third straight year East Campus's answer to Woodstock is back Friday by popular demand and with it Ballin' Jack, Bumpy Action, Flippers, Last Chance, and Cricket, according to Steve Voigt, East Union dance and concert chairperson.

Cornstock III will sprout up between H.C. Filley Hall and the Department of Information at 12:30 p.m. with the Flippers. At 2 p.m. Cricket (until 3:30 p.m.), a group popular with Little Bo frequenters, Voigt said.

"We've split the playing time for the lead band, Ballin' Jack, so that people coming and going and just dropping in between classes will have a better chance of hearing them," Voigt said. Ballin' Jack will play from 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. and from 7:30 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Bumpy Action will play from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. and Last Chance from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Since afternoon classes are not held on Spring Day, and few traditional activities are held anymore, Voigt said Cornstock has become the Spring Day celebration not only for East Campus but for downtown students as well.

"Last year about three-quarters of the all-day crowd was from downtown. It was nice to see them realize that not everyone wears cowboy hats here," Voigt said.

"We're hoping for good weather so folks can come out and soak up a few rays. With three stages, the bands will set up ahead of time and keep the music going all the time," Voigt said.

Sunshine or not, Cornstock will go on. In case of rain, the activities will move inside to the East Campus Activities Building, he added.
