

THE VIRGINIAN, 1929, 105 minutes Starring Gary Cooper, Mars Brian, Walter Huston, Richard Arlen, Directud by Vistor Henring During the 1930's the Western was singing cowboys and Grade B formulae with two major exceptions—THE VIRGINIAN and John Ford's STAGECOACH (1935) (which we are showing on July 16). Henring's film marked the first great breakthrough of sound in the Western, establishing a mode of mystic realism

LITTLE CAESAR, 1931, 95 minutes Storring Edward G. Robinson, Douglas Larbanks, Ir-Sidney Blackmer, Glenda Fartell, Directed by Mervyn LeRoy This is perfams Robinson's greatest role and one for which he is widely imitated and internationally renowned LITTLE CAESAR is an archetypal gaugster film as THE VIRGINIAN and STAGECOACH are archetymal westerns. are archetypal westerns.

DRACULA, 1931, 90 minutes Starring Bela Lugosi, David Manners and Helen Chandler Directed by Tod Browning A gothic horror-classic based on the novel by Brian Stokes, The ominous atmosphere of a weard castle, the foggy streets of London and a cavernous basement provide the perfect setting for the arch blood sucking fiend, Count Dracula, the Transylvania Vampire which Bela Lugosi has made famous and which all other vampire movie makers have been copying ever SHICE

July 9 INTERNATIONAL HOUSE, 1933, 85 minutes Starring W.C. Fields, Gracie Allen, Baby Rose Marie, Cab Calloway, Feggy Hopkins Joyce, George Burns and Bela Lugost. STAFFI COACH, 1939, 105 minutes. Starring John Wavne, Chire Trevor, Andy Devine and Thomas Mitchell. Directed by John Ford, recently recognized by The American Film Institute as one of the greatest directors of American Film. This is the hallmark western along with THE VIRGINIAN (which we are showing on June 18) of the decade of the 1930's. #### July 23

ROARING TWENTIES, 1939, 95 minutes, Starring James Cagney, Humphrey Bogart, Princilla Lane, Frank McHugh and Gladys George, Directed by Raoul Walsh, Cagney and Hogart are their familiar selves as very tough World War I buildies who clash in a vicious boutlegging racker.

#### July 30

THE RAVEN, 1935, 76 minutes, Starring Boris Karloff, Bela Lugosi, Irene Ware and Samuel S. Hinds: Directed by Louis Friedlander, An operatic shocker, in the finest tradition of the American Horror Film. A surgeon, obsessed by the works of Foe, builds an elaborate torture chamber complete with pit and pendulum.

#### August 6

THE COCOANUTS, 1929, 111 minutes. Starring the Marx Brothers, Groucho, Harpo, Chico, Zeppo and Mary Dumont, Mary Eaton, and Kay Francis Directed by Robert Florey and Joseph Stanley, Based on the play by George S. Kaufman and Morris Ryskind with music and lyrics by Irving Berlin. Cocoanuts was the Marx Brothers first film with some of their best stage routines including Groucho's land auction in excruciating "viaduct" dialog. It is probably the best of the Marx Brothers films for studying, or better enjoying, their comic for studying, or better enjoying, their comic technique

Newsreels of the 20's, 30's and 40's will be shown with all the films.


