## No change for Big Red

A lot of things have changed at the University of Nebraska since 1923, but NU football hasn't, according to UNL

Chancellor James Zumberge. He told about 80 alumni that NU football is the same today as in 1923 when it beat Notre Dame, 14-7.

school graduates decrease. "Days of radicalism are days of the past . . . all over the United States," he said. The UNL students are serious-minded, students with 93 per cent from Nebraska. He called the faculty competent.

Zumberge reviewed changes in NU and answered questions for the alumni Saturday during the annual Alumni Round-up. Alvarez is learning to play the bass guitar in one of the prison's basic music classes. He said it helps pass the time.

He said he would like to enroll in the prison's electronics or welding classes so that in case he gets out of prison he will have a skill. At

the time of the murder he was taking care of yards for a Lincoln landscaping company.

Alvarez said things have improved at the prison since the new warden, Charles Wolff, arrived.

"If a prisoner doesn't get loud and indignant when he's talking to Wolff, Wolff tries to help the prisoner with whatever problem the prisoner may have," Alvarez said. "If a prisoner does get loud with Wolff, Wolff won't even talk to him."

If Alvarez were to get out of prison today he said the thing he'd like to do most would be to pick up his son, whom he has never seen, settle down and get married. He said his mother was talking about moving to Texas and maybe he'd go there with her or back to Colorado.
