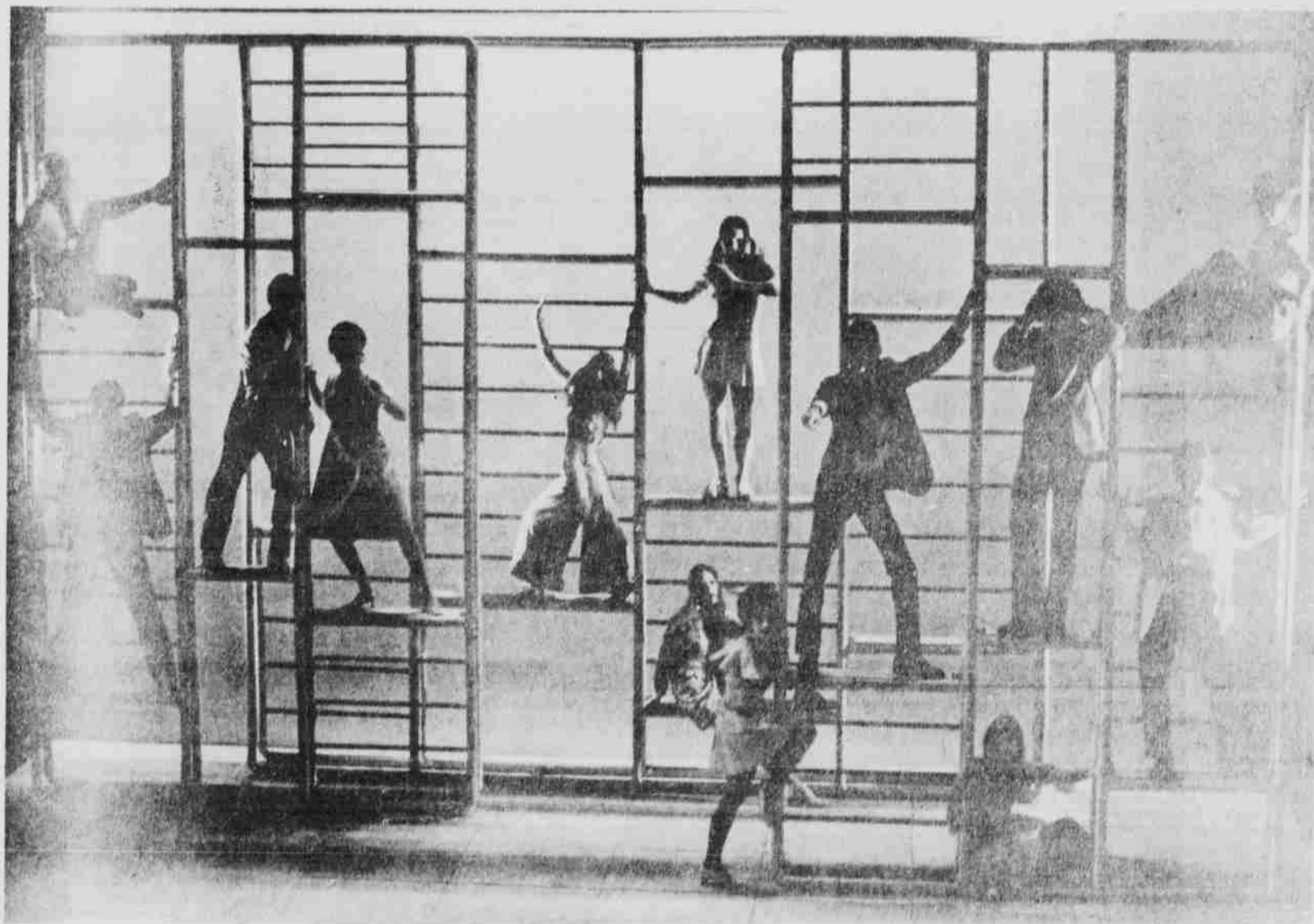




COMPANY
