

Violinist joins UNL visiting artists program

Charles Treger, acclaimed as one of the top four violinists performing today, has joined pianist Grant Johnson and cellist Zara Nelsova as a UNL visiting artist during the 1973-74 academic year.

The three artists will perform individually and together in public concerts within the University and at schools and communities throughout the state. In

addition they will participate in seminars, conducting master's classes and working with advanced musicians.

The visiting artists program was initiated last year to UNL and the state the great performing artists of the work, NU President D.B. Varner said.

In 1962, Treger won the coveted First Prize at the

International Wieniawski Competition in Poznan, Poland.



YWCA, university coordinate classes

The fall classes for the health, physical education and recreation department at the YWCA, 1432 N., will begin the week of Sept. 10.

Most of the classes meet once a week for seven weeks. Another session will start Oct. 29.

Familiar classes to be offered again include the swimming program, with lessons for both children and adults, and family swims. Seven figurine classes are offered with a special discussion in the mornings. Aqua fitness classes also are available.

Musical gym for children is a course in coordination, control and rhythm for 4- and 5-year olds. Tumbling for children 6 and over and gymnastics for junior high age and over children are scheduled.

New classes in the pool are "drownproofing," a family course of rescue and safety skills in the water, and a husband and wife swimming class.

International folk dancing is a new routine for husbands, wives, singles and teens. Yoga, self-defense, volleyball and beginning tennis are offered.

Working women now may take advantage of the facilities over the noon hour. The "lunch hour special" includes use of the gym, pool and fitness room from noon to 1 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Other classes at the YWCA include antiques, bridge, creative writing, crocheting, Danish embroidery, genealogy, knitting, lingerie making, macramé, painting, poetry writing, weaving, woodcarving and Oriental cooking.

Rock concert set for Sunday

The Lincoln Parks and Recreation Department is sponsoring a free rock concert, starring Last Chance, Oedipus and Dr. Feelgood, Sunday at 3 p.m. at Pinewood Bowl at Pioneer Park, according to Steve Hiller of the department.

The department sponsored a similar concert in August, Hiller said, but because of lack of publicity only about 1,000 persons attended. Hiller said he is planning on between 3,000 to 5,000 persons Sunday.
